Consider An **Ordinance Canvassing The Returns And Declaring The Results Of The Carrollton Bond Election Held May 2, 2026.**

**BACKGROUND:**

In accordance with the State Election Code, the City Council is the canvassing authority for the May 2, 2026 Carrollton Bond Election. Bond Propositions A through E were submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Carrollton, TX.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:**

Staff recommends approval of the Ordinance canvassing the returns and declaring the results of the City of Carrollton's Bond Election held May 2, 2026.

**ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF A BOND ELECTION; PROVIDING A SAVINGS, AN ENFORCEMENT, AND A REPEALING CLAUSE; FINDING THAT THE MEETING IN WHICH THIS ORDINANCE WAS ADOPTED WAS HELD IN COMPLIANCE WITH STATE LAW; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

**WHEREAS**, on February 3, 2026, the City Council of the City of Carrollton (the “City Council”) ordered an election to be held on May 2, 2026, for the purpose of determining whether the resident, qualified voters of the City of Carrollton (the “City”) would authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds by the City; and

**WHEREAS**, it is hereby found and determined that notice of the election was duly given in the form, manner and time required by law, and said election was in all respects legally held and conducted in accordance with applicable laws of the State of Texas and the proceedings calling and governing the holding of such election; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council hereby canvasses the returns of this election, at which there were submitted to all resident, qualified voters of the City for their action thereupon, the following propositions:

**PROPOSITION A**

“SHALL the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$164,500,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: designing, acquiring, constructing, maintaining, renovating, improving, repairing, extending, expanding, and enhancing streets, including thoroughfares, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, intersections, screening walls, and other public ways, participation in joint projects with federal, state, and local public entities and agencies, computerized signalization and monitoring equipment, and other traffic controls, grade separations, street lighting, necessary or incidental utility relocation, and drainage improvements in connection with the foregoing and the acquisition of land, easements, rights-of-way, and other real property interests related thereto; said bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and shall the City Council of the City be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?”

## PROPOSITION B

“SHALL the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$32,345,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: acquiring, constructing, renovating, improving, expanding, furnishing, and equipping public safety facilities, including the acquisition of any related land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and shall the City Council of the City be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?”

## PROPOSITION C

“SHALL the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$26,530,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: acquiring, constructing, renovating, developing, improving, expanding, furnishing, and equipping park and recreational facilities, including the acquisition of any related land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and shall the City Council of the City be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?”

## PROPOSITION D

“SHALL the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$7,850,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: acquiring, constructing, renovating, developing, improving, expanding, furnishing, and equipping municipal court facilities, including the acquisition of any related land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and shall the City Council of the City be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?”

**PROPOSITION E**

“SHALL the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$3,775,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: acquiring, constructing, renovating, developing, improving, expanding, furnishing, and equipping library facilities, including the acquisition of any related land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and shall the City Council of the City be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?”

**WHEREAS**, the Council has diligently inquired into the poll lists and the official election results which were duly and lawfully made to the Council by the judges and clerks holding and conducting such election; the poll lists and the official election returns showing separately the votes cast in the election ;and

**WHEREAS**, from these returns, this Council hereby finds that the following votes were cast in the election by voters who were resident, qualified voters of the City:

“The issuance of \$164,500,000 general obligation bonds for street improvements including sidewalk, alley, and other traffic flow improvements and the imposition of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds”

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, THAT:**

**SECTION 1**

All the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the City Council, and they are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

**SECTION 2**

The City Council officially finds, determines, and declares that the election was duly and properly ordered, that proper legal notice of such election was duly given in the English, Spanish, and Vietnamese language (to the extent required by law), that proper election officers were duly appointed prior to the election, that the election was duly and legally held, that all resident, qualified voters of the City were permitted to vote at the election, that due returns of the results of the election had been made and delivered, and that the City Council has duly canvassed such returns, all in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and of the United States of America, and the ordinance calling the election.

**SECTION 3**

A MAJORITY of the resident, qualified voters of the City of Carrollton, Texas voting in such election, having voted [FOR/AGAINST] the authorization and issuance of \$164,500,000 bonds and the levy and pledge of the tax in payment thereof as provided in Proposition A, the City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition A [carried/was unsupported] at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law[, and that the City Council is hereby accordingly authorized to issue the bonds and to levy the tax in accordance with the authority granted in the Proposition and with law].

#### **SECTION 4**

A MAJORITY of the resident, qualified voters of the City of Carrollton, Texas voting in such election, having voted [FOR/AGAINST] the authorization and issuance of \$32,345,000 of bonds and the levy and pledge of the tax in payment thereof as provided in Proposition B, the City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition B [carried/was unsupported] at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law[, and that the City Council is hereby accordingly authorized to issue the bonds and to levy the tax in accordance with the authority granted in the Proposition and with law].

#### **SECTION 5**

A MAJORITY of the resident, qualified voters of the City of Carrollton, Texas voting in such election, having voted [FOR/AGAINST] the authorization and issuance of \$26,530,000 of bonds and the levy and pledge of the tax in payment thereof as provided in Proposition C, the City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition C [carried/was unsupported] at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law[, and that the City Council is hereby accordingly authorized to issue the bonds and to levy the tax in accordance with the authority granted in the Proposition and with law].

#### **SECTION 6**

A MAJORITY of the resident, qualified voters of the City of Carrollton, Texas voting in such election, having voted [FOR/AGAINST] the authorization and issuance of \$7,850,000 of bonds and the levy and pledge of the tax in payment thereof as provided in Proposition D, the City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition D [carried/was unsupported] at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law[, and that the City Council is hereby accordingly authorized to issue the bonds and to levy the tax in accordance with the authority granted in the Proposition and with law].

#### **SECTION 7**

A MAJORITY of the resident, qualified voters of the City of Carrollton, Texas voting in such election, having voted [FOR/AGAINST] the authorization and issuance of \$3,775,000 of bonds and the levy and pledge of the tax in payment thereof as provided in Proposition E, the City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition E [carried/was unsupported] at the election, that the election was duly called, that proper notice was given, and that the election was held in all aspects in conformity with the law, and that the City Council is hereby accordingly authorized to issue the bonds and to levy the tax in accordance with the authority granted in the Proposition and with law.

#### **SECTION 8**

All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

**SECTION 9**

This Ordinance shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

**SECTION 10**

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable in accordance with Section 10.07 of the Code of Ordinance, City of Carrollton, Texas.

**SECTION 11**

It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by Texas Government Code Section 551, as amended.

**SECTION 12**

This Ordinance is effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON GENERAL ELECTION HELD MAY 2, 2026, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND COUNCIL PLACES 2, 4, AND 6.**

**WHEREAS**, on February 3, 2026, the City Council of the City of Carrollton (the “City Council”) ordered a General Election to be held on May 2, 2026, for the purpose electing a Mayor and Council Members to places 2, 4, and 6; and

**WHEREAS**, notice of said election was given by the City of Carrollton, Texas (the “City”) as required by law; and

**WHEREAS**, said election was duly and legally held on May 2, 2026, in conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of said election have been certified and returned by the proper judges and clerks thereof; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has considered the returns of said election held May 2, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, the election returns, duly and legally made, showed that there were 6873 ballots cast in the election and that each candidate in the election received the following votes:

**SECTION 1.**

All the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the City Council, and they are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

**SECTION 2.**

It is determined the results of the May 2, 2026 General Election as canvassed and tabulated reflect the expressed desires of the qualified voters of the City.

**SECTION 3.**

It is hereby found and determined that no runoff election is required, as each candidate for the respective places received a majority of the votes cast, in accordance with the City Charter and applicable state law.

**SECTION 4.**

In accordance with Texas Election Code §67.004(b), a tabulation setting forth the following information for each candidate is attached as follows:

1. The total number of votes received in each precinct, the sum of the precinct totals, and the total number of voters in each precinct who cast a ballot for a candidate, for Collin County is attached hereto as Exhibit “A” and incorporated herein by reference as if written word for word.
2. The total number of votes received in each precinct, the sum of the precinct totals, and the total number of voters in each precinct who cast a ballot for a candidate, for Dallas County is attached hereto as Exhibit “B” and incorporated herein by reference as if written word for word.
3. The total number of votes received in each precinct, the sum of the precinct totals, and the total number of voters in each precinct who cast a ballot for a candidate, for Denton County is attached hereto as Exhibit “C” and incorporated herein by reference as if written word for word.

**SECTION 5.**

Steve Babick, Mayor; Jason Carpenter, Council Place 2; Lisa Sutter, Council Place 4; Daisy Palomo, Council Place 6, all received the majority of the votes cast and are declared duly elected, subject to the taking of the oath of office.

**SECTION 6.**

This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage.
