ORDINANCE NO. _____ OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON AMENDING CHAPTER 54, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE GENERAL DESIGN STANDARDS, OF THE CARROLLTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, BY ALLOWING VARIOUS RESIDENTIAL STREET WIDTHS; AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$500 PER DAY, SAVINGS, SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE ON AND AFTER ITS ADOPTION AND PUBLICATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS:

Section 1.

That the Code of Ordinances, City of Carrollton, Texas is hereby amended as shown in the attached General Design Standards, Detail P-2, Sheet 1 of 8 in Part B of the Standard Details, "Lane Standards" as included in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.

[This Sheet reflects that residential lane width is modified to allow a width of 28 to 30 feet.]

Section 2.

Penalty Clause

That any person violating a provision of this ordinance, upon conviction, is guilty of an offense punishable as provided in Section 10.99 of the Carrollton City Code.

Section 3.

Savings

That except as herein amended, Title V, Chapter 54, otherwise known as the General Design Standards of the Code of the Carrollton, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4.
Severability Clause

That the provisions of this ordinance are severable in accordance with Section 10.07 of the Carrollton City Code.

Section 5.
Repealing Clause

To the extent of any prior ordinance of the City of Carrollton (or any provision, clause, phrase, sentence or paragraph contained therein) conflicts with this ordinance, said conflicting ordinance, provision, clause, phrase, sentence or paragraph is hereby repealed.

Section 6.

That this ordinance shall become and be effective on and after its adoption and publication.
