CARROLLTON CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING AND WORKSESSION FEBRUARY 18, 2025

The City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas convened in a Regular Meeting and Worksession on Tuesday, February 18, 2025 at 5:45 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Steve Babick, Mayor Pro Tem Richard Fleming, Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Christopher Axberg, Councilmembers Nancy Cline, Jason Carpenter, Andrew Palacios, Daisy Palomo, and Rowena Watters. Also present were Assistant City Manager Chrystal Davis, Assistant City Manager Shannon Hicks, City Attorney Meredith Ladd and City Secretary Chloe Sawatzky.

5:45 P.M. – COUNCIL BRIEFING ROOM

***PRE-MEETING ***

Mayor Babick called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

1. Receive information and discuss Agenda.

Agenda items were reviewed. Staff responded to Council's questions. City Secretary Chloe Sawatzky noted a minor edit to the January 21st meeting minutes.

*****EXECUTIVE SESSION*****

Executive Session was convened at the conclusion of all Worksession items.

- 2. Council convened Executive Session at 8:50 p.m. pursuant to Texas Government Code:
 - Section 551.071 for private consultation with the City Attorney to seek legal advice with respect to pending and contemplated litigation and including all matters on this agenda to which the City Attorney has a duty under the Texas Rules of Discipline and Professional Conduct regarding confidential communication with the City Council.
 - Section 551.087 to discuss Economic Development.
- **3.** Council reconvened Open Session at 8:57 p.m. to consider action, if any, on matters discussed in the Executive Session. No action was taken.

Meeting adjourned at 8:57 p.m.

WORKSESSION

4. Receive Update On The 2025 LIV Golf Dallas Tournament.

Christopher Szymczyk, Economic Development Manager, provided an overview of the 2024 LIV Golf Tournament and provided introductory remarks regarding the 2025 Tournament proposal.

James Clark, Vice President of Outlyr and Tournament Director, offered remarks on last year's attendance, economic impact, sustainability, and expenses, adding that expenses were more than the \$4.7 million previously mentioned. He advised that the concession program resulted in \$35,000 to local volunteer groups. He stated that there were more than 750 volunteers in total from various states. Mr. Clark stated that in 2024 the city's contribution to the event was \$85,000 and for 2025, \$186,000 is being requested. The economic impact for the 2025 tournament is anticipated to be greater than in 2024.

Mr. Clark offered comments as to the coordination with the Carrollton Farmers Branch School District and the use of school parking lots during the event. Recognition of the District's Teachers of the Year occurred at last year's event; some students from the school district participated. In response to Mayor Pro Tem Fleming's question, Outlyr did make a donation to the school district.

It was noted that the 2025 tournament will not be a team championship event as it was last year and will be held in June. It was also clarified that this is the only LIV Tournament to be held in the state of Texas.

Mayor Babick commented that the item on the Consent Agenda related to this discussion is approval for the City of Carrollton to apply to the State as the host city.

5. Receive Briefing From CFBISD.

Randy Schackmann, CFB School Board President, advised that currently the District has 9,800 empty seats due to declining enrollment. He advised that the Board has discussed a proposal to consolidate four campuses. He introduced Chris Moore, Assistant Superintendent of Operations, who made a presentation.

Mr. Moore stated that the District has a close relationship with the City of Carrollton and shared information the School Board has been considering. He advised that in 2023 the Board adopted a deficit budget. A capacity study was conducted based on enrollment from the fall of 2023 through the spring of 2024. The recommendation from that study was to consolidate three elementary campuses and one middle school campus. Mr. Moore added that the Board also adopted a deficit budget for 2024. A demographics study was done in the fall of 2024. Community input was received and a Facility Planning Advisory Group was formed. The school principals recommended individuals to participate.

Mr. Moore added that the facility study also stated that 23 of the 34 CFB schools are at 75 percent or less capacity. Over the past five years, there has been 4.7 percent decline in student enrollment. That trend is expected to continue over the next ten years. Mr. Moore stated that the Board of Trustees met in February and recommended consolidating the following campuses: Central Elementary, Furneaux Elementary, McCoy Elementary and Long Middle School. He provided a chart reflecting that other school districts in the North Texas area are experiencing similar declining enrollments. Mr. Moore provided a website and contact information for those who are interested in obtaining more information on this matter.

Mayor Babick stated that even though the city has no oversight or authority pertaining to the school district, the Council may have some questions. Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Axberg asked Mr. Moore what is driving the lower enrollment. Mr. Moore responded that birthrates are declining, and families are relocating further north to Collin County and to Kaufman County, southeast of the metro area. He stated that there are more choices for families now, including charter schools.

Discussion followed regarding the makeup of the Facility Planning Group. Mr. Moore advised that the criteria and other information used by the group is available as public information. Councilmember Palomo inquired about the growth west of I35 (Irving) area, in particular whether it was discussed to possibly remove that area from the school district. Similarly, for some schools in Dallas that are also in CFBISD. Mr. Moore stated there was no discussion about splitting the school district to remove those schools. Councilmember Palacios inquired as to what information is on the website. Mr. Moore stated that the timeline, process, presentations, FAQs, and the rezoning proposal are available.

Discussion specifically related to McCoy Elementary followed as to where those students would be reassigned. Mr. Moore advised that it is yet to be finalized and input is currently being accepted on that matter.

Mayor Babick asked Mr. Moore whether consideration was given to the new residential developments and how they might impact school populations. Mr. Moore replied no, that was not considered. The Mayor inquired about the school buildings being left vacant. Mr. Moore responded that the District does not intend to leave the buildings vacant. Mayor Babick advised that the Council will assemble its points of view regarding the campus closings and provide that to the School Board, as well as any public comments the city receives.

Councilmember Watters confirmed with Mr. Moore that communication with the residents is available through the website.

6. Receive Update On The Progress Of The Downtown Grain Silo Mural.

On September 24, 2024, City Council selected Articulation Art to create a Downtown Mural Program. The grain silos were the first canvas selected to receive a new mural. Lesli Marshall, from Articulation Art, provided an update on the Downtown Grain Silos Mural.

Ms. Marshall advised that the Downtown Arts Council discussed various themes and styles for the Grain Silos Mural. Eight different artists representing mixed media, nature and photo realism were considered to create the mural. Artist Clyde Thompson was selected. Two review sessions with the artist and the Arts Council have been held. As a result, it was decided to include local flora, history and trains into the mural design. Sketches were presented that incorporate new and old trains, and flora. Final review of the design will occur in the first week of March, and the project will begin the first week of April.

Mayor Babick added that some of Carrollton's local artists are on the Arts Council. Ms. Marshall noted that there will be other Downtown areas where additional murals can be placed.

Following Item 6, at 7:01 p.m., Mayor Babick adjourned the Worksession to convene the Regular Meeting.

At 8:25 p.m. following the conclusion of the Regular Meeting the Worksession was reconvened beginning with Item 7.

7. Discuss Nomination Of Rising Star Honoree For Metrocrest Chamber.

The Metrocrest Chamber Rising Star Award is presented to individuals within the Chamber cities as selected by the Town/City and Mayor/Councils. Nominees make contributions to their communities, demonstrate leadership qualities, and typically are young professionals that serve in volunteer or professional capacities within the respective Town/City.

Names submitted by Council included Annette Reese, Keri Bailiff, Natasha Singh and Dave Hermon. Grace Currie's name was also suggested, however following discussion, it was decided that since she is a city employee she would not be included for consideration.

Mayor Babick polled the Council members and Annette Reese was selected as Carrollton's Rising Star Award recipient.

Councilmember Carpenter asked James Clark, Vice President of Outlyr and Tournament Director, for a response to the comments from the public speaker, Adam Polter. Mr. Clark advised that the state's legislation has been reviewed by attorneys and is found to be legal. He said it is intentionally vague so that contracts can be customized for different cities. He noted the State would be reimbursing the city for their contribution.

Councilmember Axberg asked City Attorney Meredith Ladd if she has reviewed the contract. She advised that she has and it has been approved the by the state.

Mayor Babick reviewed that this item is only to consider approving the application to the state. He noted that last year Outlyr paid the expense for first responders during the event.

Councilmember Palomo asked Mr. Clark to review the community impact from last year's event. He responded that the concession program resulted in \$36,000 to local charities, and that LIV recognized the CFBISD Teachers of the Year and students.

Mayor Pro Tem Fleming asked Mr. Clark if he has a copy of the economic impact study and will it be provided to the city. Mr. Clark advised he has no access to the study. Mayor Pro Tem Fleming advised he researched the sales tax increasing during the event and it appears there was an increase of approximately \$3 million during the event. He went on to read documentation that says the LIV organization originates from Saudi Arabia. He spoke in opposition to Carrollton's involvement.

Councilmember Watters spoke regarding the impact last year in some neighborhoods. Mr. Clark responded that Outlyr has already had a meeting with Carrollton's emergency action team.

Mayor Babick stated that last year's economic impact to Carrollton and its surrounding cities was \$38 million. The state's percentage of sales tax was 6.25 percent, or approximately \$2.5 million. He advised the state has this program to attract events. He said that if the Council approves the application, it is anticipated that the city will contribute \$186,000 up front and be refunded that amount later.

Councilmember Axberg moved to approve Item 25; second by Councilmember Palomo.

Mayor Pro Tem Fleming commented that the city should have the study in order to make an informed decision. Based on the information he obtained, Saudi Arabia is the location where the LIV

organization is based and the city of Carrollton should not be doing business (or providing funds) with that organization.

Councilmember Palomo stated that last year, a volunteer organization, LovPacs, that provides lunches to school children, netted \$14,000 from their concessions.

The motion was approved with a vote of 6-1. Mayor Pro Tem Fleming voted in opposition.

The City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas convened in a Regular Meeting and Worksession on Tuesday, April 15, 2025 at 5:45 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Steve Babick, Mayor Pro Tem Richard Fleming, Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Christopher Axberg, Councilmembers Nancy Cline, Jason Carpenter, Andrew Palacios, Daisy Palomo, and Rowena Watters. Also present were City Manager Erin Rinehart, Assistant City Manager Chrystal Davis, Assistant City Manager Shannon Hicks, City Attorney Meredith Ladd and City Secretary Chloe Sawatzky.

5:45 P.M. – COUNCIL BRIEFING ROOM

***PRE-MEETING ***

Mayor Babick called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

1. Receive information and discuss Agenda.

Agenda items were reviewed. Staff responded to Council's questions.

*****EXECUTIVE SESSION*****

- 2. Council will convene into Executive Session pursuant to Texas Government Code:
 - Section 551.071 for private consultation with the City Attorney to seek legal advice with respect to pending and contemplated litigation and including all matters on this agenda to which the City Attorney has a duty under the Texas Rules of Discipline and Professional Conduct regarding confidential communication with the City Council.

WORKSESSION

4. Receive Briefing on Lewisville Schools Bond Election.

Dr. Lori Rapp, Lewisville Independent School District Superintendent, provided an update on the 2023 LISD Bond Election and also provided statistical data on the District.

Dr. Rapp stated that LISD is one of the top 20 largest districts in the state. With over 47,000 students it covers 127 square miles and has 69 campuses. Statistics for the Class of 2024 were reviewed and demographics were provided. She stated that declining enrollment and lack of increases in state funding over the past several years prompted the District to establish a Community Efficiency Committee to evaluate the potential for closing some elementary campuses. As a result, five campuses will close after the current school year ends.

Dr. Rapp provided a video reflecting the uses of some of the bond funds approved in the 2023 election. It included playground equipment, furniture, flooring, casework, technology updates, and other facility improvements. Information on the tax rate supporting the bond sale was provided.

Dr. Rapp advised that the state Legislature is considering school funding in this current session. She advised that the basic allotment per student needs to be increased by \$1,340 to support students in the future.

Clarifying questions were raised by Council regarding the percentage of economically disadvantaged students (those who qualify for free or reduced lunches) and inflationary impacts. Mayor Babick inquired about how the Career Center successes are measured. Dr. Rapp stated that it is based on the number of industry based certifications received by students in the career centers. She noted that some students will go directly into a career and others will go on to enroll in related college degree programs.

Discussion regarding the criteria used to evaluate school closings followed. Dr. Rapp advised that ten criteria were used in the evaluation process and the results were posted online.

5. Receive Information From Community Group Regarding Juneteenth.

Mayor Pro Tem Richard Fleming advised that a Juneteenth Committee was formed consisting of 13 volunteers from the community. He provided a list of their names and expressed his appreciation, adding that the group has met four times.

Mayor Pro Tem Fleming advised that that two events have been planned as follows:

- 1) "Juneteenth- Telling Your Story" at the Carrollton Josey Ranch Library; June 15th, 1-3 p.m.
- 2) "Juneteenth Celebration Food and Jazz Concert" at the Downtown Square; June 21st, 5 p.m.

The concert is being held in conjunction with the Shirley Demus-Tarpley Philanthropic Organization.

6. Mayor and Council Reports And Information Sharing.

Council reviewed their recent activities and upcoming events.

Mayor Babick stated that a work session is being planned to brief the Council regarding Transit 2.0 by the Council of Governments (COG) and DART. The date is pending. He also described some handouts provided to the Council.

BACKGROUND:

This agenda item is for purchasing fire equipment, tools, and related mounting hardware used by firefighters during both non-emergency and emergency operations. Due to the anticipated replacement of damaged, outdated, and end-of-life tools, equipment, and related mounting hardware, Carrollton Fire Rescue will surpass the \$50,000.00 purchasing threshold during Fiscal Year 2025. Carrollton Fire Rescue is seeking Council approval to purchase fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware in an amount not to exceed \$59,000.00 during Fiscal Year 2025.

The fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware will be purchased through our interlocal agreement with Buy-Board. Texas law authorizes this process so that the City can save the time of developing specifications and avoid the duplication of the competitive bidding process. Buy-Board meets all the state of Texas bidding requirements.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware will be purchased from funds budgeted in the Fire Department's Fiscal Year 2025 budget.

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY:

The fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware are used during the course of responding to and mitigating both non-emergency and emergency incidents. The fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware are designed to be used by firefighters during emergency operations,

including structure fires, vehicle fires, rubbish fires, grass fires, vehicle collisions, rescue operations, and any other hazardous situation in which fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware are required.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

Staff recommends authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Siddons-Martin Emergency Group for fire equipment, tools, and mounting hardware in an amount not to exceed \$59,000.00. This purchase will be through an Interlocal Agreement with Buy-Board.

Consider Authorizing The City Manager To Approve A Contract With Ratliff Hardscape Ltd. For Phase 2 Of The Plano Parkway Park Project In An Amount Not To Exceed \$919,930.00.

BACKGROUND:

In February 2021, Council approved a Resolution to execute a license agreement with Lewisville Independent School District (LISD) to use the School District's property located at the northwest corner of Plano Parkway and Warmington Drive to construct a parking lot and public park, recently named "Tor Hill Park". The School District would allow the City to build a concrete parking lot with 130 parking spaces and a public neighborhood park on the remaining three (3) acres.

Last May, City Council awarded Axis Contracting Phase 1 of the park project. This phase of the project included the construction of a parking lot, the widening of Warmington Drive, and associated drainage improvements. Construction on Phase 1 should be finalized in approximately 1 month.

Phase 2 of the project includes the installation of playground facilities, a prefabricated pavilion, a concrete trail, a park monument sign, landscape and irrigation, as well as other related items.

In January 2024, Council recommended rejecting all bids for the initial combined project construction. The low bid for the combined project was \$4.2 million. Phase 1 of the project totaled approximately \$2.3 million and, combined with Phase 2 of the project, the total construction costs will be approximately \$3.2 million, saving \$1 million by separating the project into two phases.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Status: Consent Agenda

File Type: Contracts/Agreements The Engineer's Estimate for this project was \$1,225,000.00. Twelve (12) bids were received on April 1, 2025. Bids ranged from \$876,124.00 to a high bid of \$1,057,051,465.33 (Assumed to be an Error). The low bid was submitted by Ratliff Hardscape, Ltd.

In recent years, the Contractor has successfully completed several projects for surrounding municipalities.

All references spoke highly of the work done by the Contractor. The Contractor showed no issues meeting budgets and timelines of past projects; they appear capable of completing this project in the allocated time of 180 days.

Staff recommends the inclusion of a construction contingency. The construction contingency provides an expedient manner to accommodate unforeseen costs and minor additions in work common in all construction projects. Examples include unexpected conditions discovered during construction, and changes to design that were not possible during plan generation. All charges against contingency must be supported by detailed pricing information and approved by the City through a formal change order. However, having advanced Council authorization ensures that work progress is not impeded. As a cost control measure, the construction contingency for Phase 2 of the project is recommended at 5% (original contract amount) or \$43,806.00. Funding is available in Parks funds.

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY:

This project will support the City Council's strategic objectives and vision of building a community that families and businesses want to call home by:

• Providing a neighborhood recreation amenity near a school.

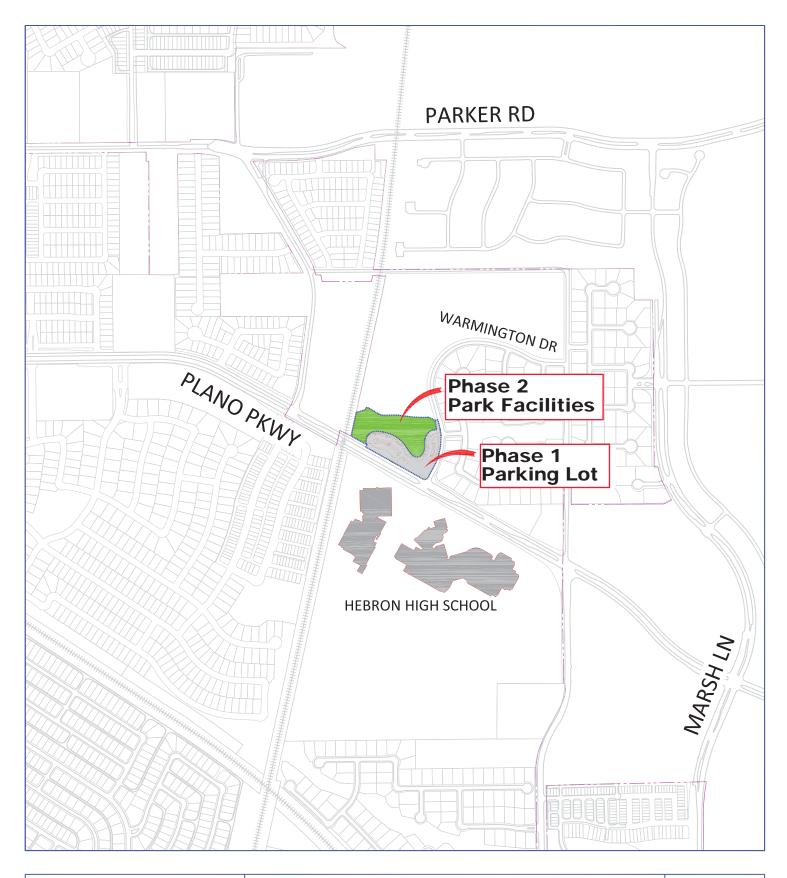
STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

BACKGROUND:

The City of Carrollton has an existing contract with Dallas Harmony Construction, LLC pursuant to RFP 24-020 for the renovation of Rosemeade Recreation Center. Work included updating floors, doors and the glass wall to current industry standards, as well as reconfigurations of the gym area to allow for volleyball and basketball to be played concurrently.

We are asking for the proposed change order to accommodate the increasing workload, increasing materials and labor pricing that is required to level the base casings of the new glass wall to refit the doors.

The current proposed change order will increase the cost of the project by \$9,970.00 for a new total of \$411,970.00.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

To ensure there is funding available to continue the services, this change order consists of an additional \$9,970.00, which increases the current contract to \$411,970.00. Funding is available in the Parks Consolidated account, 854360-122480399.

BACKGROUND:

CityView software, provided by Harris Computer Systems, is utilized as the interdepartmental inspection and administration software for the Code Enforcement, Building Inspection, Community Development, and Environmental Quality Divisions. Additionally, this system provides the mechanism and external portal to receive residential complaints applicable to these divisions.

Harris Computer Systems provides the necessary licensing and ongoing support as a part of this annual software maintenance and is critical for the Environmental Services and Development Services Departments to continue normal operations.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The CityView software is budgeted within the Environmental Services operational budget. This agenda item encompasses licensing and maintenance fees and software stabilization monitoring and support for FY 2025 and 2026 with a 15% contingency for potential maintenance fee increases in 2026.

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY:

Providing the tools utilized by various divisions that ensure the preservation of life, safety, and the public health of the community is an essential component of community sustainability.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

In addition, Council approved the addition of 2 sworn personnel (SRO Sgt. and SRO) and 1 PSO including additional tasers, body cameras and software licenses. This addition will cost \$11,347 annually.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Funding for the increase of the Police Department items has been previously approved by the City Council in the FY2025 budget.

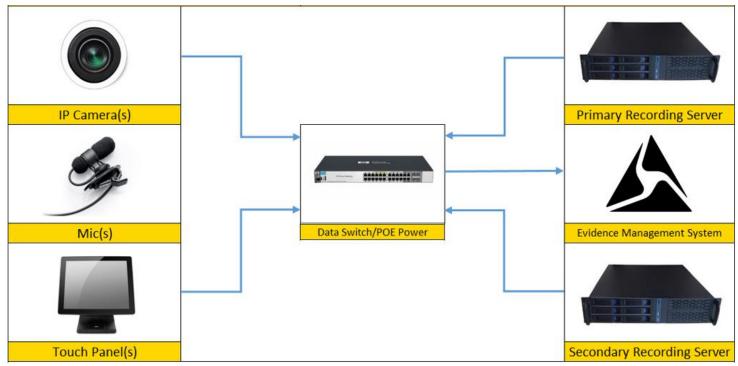

BACKGROUND:

Proposition C of the 2022 Bond Election provided for improvements at the Oak Creek Tennis Center, which was originally built in 2001. The project scope includes the construction of four additional tennis courts, eight new pickleball courts (some courts covered), expansion of the pro shop building to add restrooms with at least two showers each and a meeting room, interior remodel of the pro shop, expansion of the parking lot, and other site amenities (landscaping, sidewalks, lighting, benches, etc.). The improvements are intended to serve the continuing needs of the community and further promote the physical wellbeing of Carrollton citizens. Tennis at OCTC has continued to grow and hosting more leagues and tournaments the additional four courts are essential. Pickleball is the most requested use, and our indoor and outdoor courts cannot keep up with the demand.

The City evaluated Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) from seven architectural/engineering firms with prior tennis and pickleball center experience in selection of the design consultant. Staff members from the Engineering and Parks departments were consulted and evaluated the qualifications, experience, and proposed project management approach of each firm. Staff have identified the architectural/engineering design firm of Parkhill, Smith, and Cooper, Inc. (dba Parkhill) as the most qualified to provide the design and construction administration services. Consider A Resolution Authorizing The City Manager To Negotiate And Execute An Economic Development Incentive Agreement With UEP, Inc., Establishing A Program Of Grants To The Company For Its Expansion At 2323 McDaniel Drive, In Amounts Equal To Fifty Percent (50%) Of Taxes Paid To The City On The Assessed New Value Of Real Property And Business And Personal Property For A Maximum Term Of Five (5) Years, For A Total Incentive Amount Not To Exceed \$1,559,868.

BACKGROUND:

This agenda item is to consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute an economic development incentive agreement with UEP, Inc.

UEP, Inc. is a global leader in the manufacturing of aviation and aerospace components manufacturer specializing in military tech producing large caliber munitions, energetics and factory robotics products.

UEP intends to occupy a manufacturing facility, located at 2323 McDaniel Drive. The investment will be at least \$17 million in improvements to the facility, adding a minimum of \$188 million in new equipment and creating 60 new full-time jobs. This expansion will enable the company to produce large caliber munition, energetics, and factory robotics, as well as meet the growing demand for its products.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Staff recommends a fifty percent (50%) rebate on the assessed value of the new business and personal property taxes paid to the City, as well as a fifty percent (50%) rebate on the assessed value of real property taxes paid to the City, both for five (5) years. The dollar value of this program of tax rebates will not exceed \$1,559,868 over the term of the Agreement. No incentives to the Company will be derived from the City's General Fund.

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY:

Should UEP choose to expand at 2323 McDaniel Drive, the Company will create new jobs, as well as increase the ad valorem value of the property by making improvements to the building and adding new business and personal property.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

Staff recommends City Council approval of a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute an economic development incentive agreement with UEP, Inc.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas ("City Council") has been presented proposed terms and conditions for an Economic Development Incentive Agreement ("Agreement"), between the City of Carrollton, Texas ("City"), and UEP, Inc. ("Company"), for expansion into a manufacturing building located at 2323 McDaniel Drive, Carrollton, Texas ("Property"), establishing a program of grants to the Company in amounts equal to fifty percent (50%) of taxes paid to the City on the assessed new value of Real Property and Business Personal Property for a maximum term of five (5) years, not to exceed One Million Five Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$1,559,868); and upon the Company's completion of Eligible Improvements as defined in Article IV of the Agreement, and the hiring of new employees as defined in same Article IV; and

WHEREAS, the viability of the City's business community is important to enhancing the quality of life for Carrollton residents through the creation of jobs and the expansion of local commerce; and

WHEREAS, UEP, Inc. is an aviation and aerospace components manufacturer specializing in military tech producing large caliber munitions, energetics, and factory robotics; and plans to operate at 2323 McDaniel Drive, Carrollton, Texas, employing sixty (60) persons; and

WHEREAS, the Company is considering occupying a manufacturing building located at Property that would add the installation of new equipment with an approximate value of One Hundred Seventy-One Million Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$171,900,000) and approximately Seventeen Million Dollars (\$17,000,000) in Improvements to the Facility, and the creation of sixty (60) full-time jobs; and

WHEREAS, the Company has advised the City that a contributing factor that would induce it to expand and create new jobs at its Carrollton location would be an agreement wherein the City provides a program of grants to the Company that would enable the Company to add new product lines; and

WHEREAS, upon full review and consideration of the proposed terms and conditions of the Agreement, and all matters attendant and related thereto, the City Council is of the opinion that

the City Manager shall be authorized to negotiate and execute the Agreement, containing such terms and conditions, on behalf of the City of Carrollton;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1

All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the City Council, and they are hereby approved, ratified, and incorporated into the body of this Resolution as if a copied in their entirety.

Section 2

A term and condition of the proposed Agreement shall include a program of Grants, as further defined in the Agreement, to the Company for its Expansion of Facilities on the Property and acquisition of new Business Personal Property, said Grants shall be equal to fifty percent (50%) of the ad valorem taxes paid by the Company on the assessed new value of real property and business and personal property and received by the City for a maximum Term of five (5) years, and further shall not exceed One Million Five Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$1,559,868).

Section 3

The City Manager is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the Agreement and all other documents in connection therewith on behalf of the City of Carrollton, substantially according to the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution.

Section 4

This Resolution shall take effect upon passage.

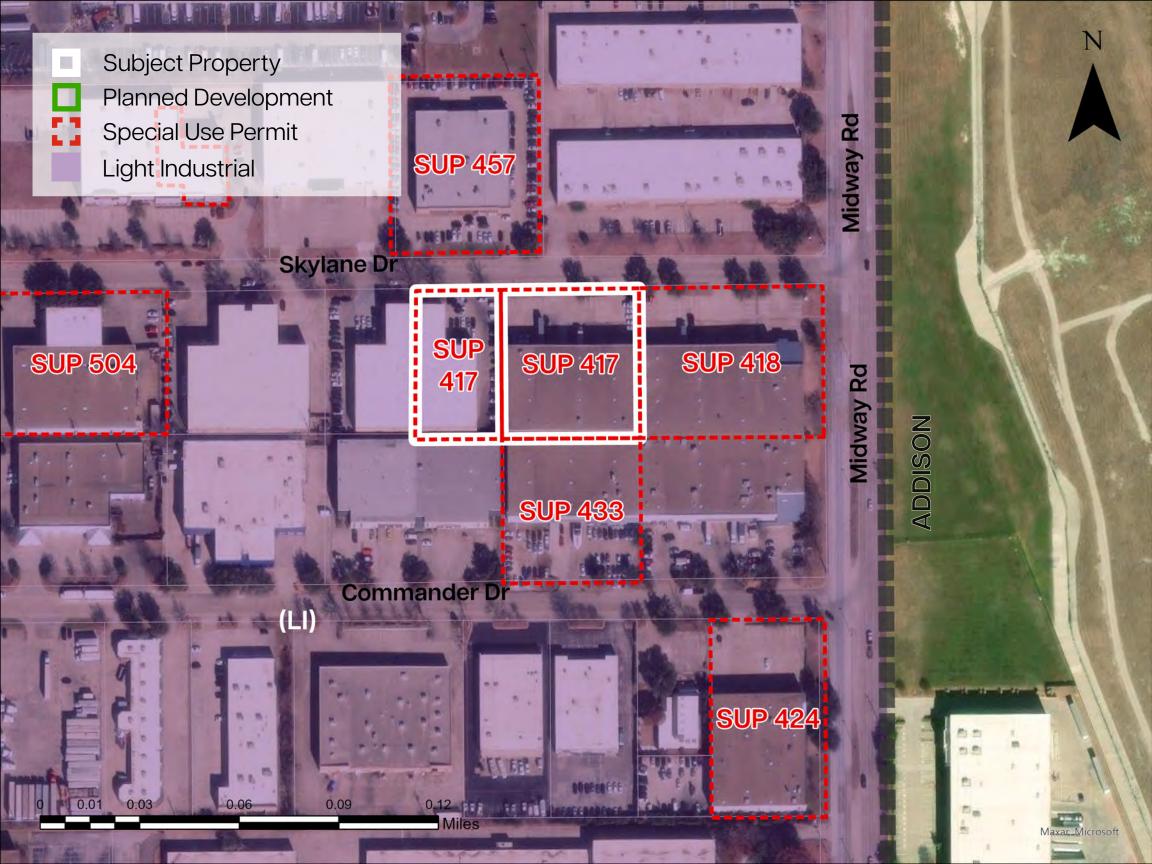

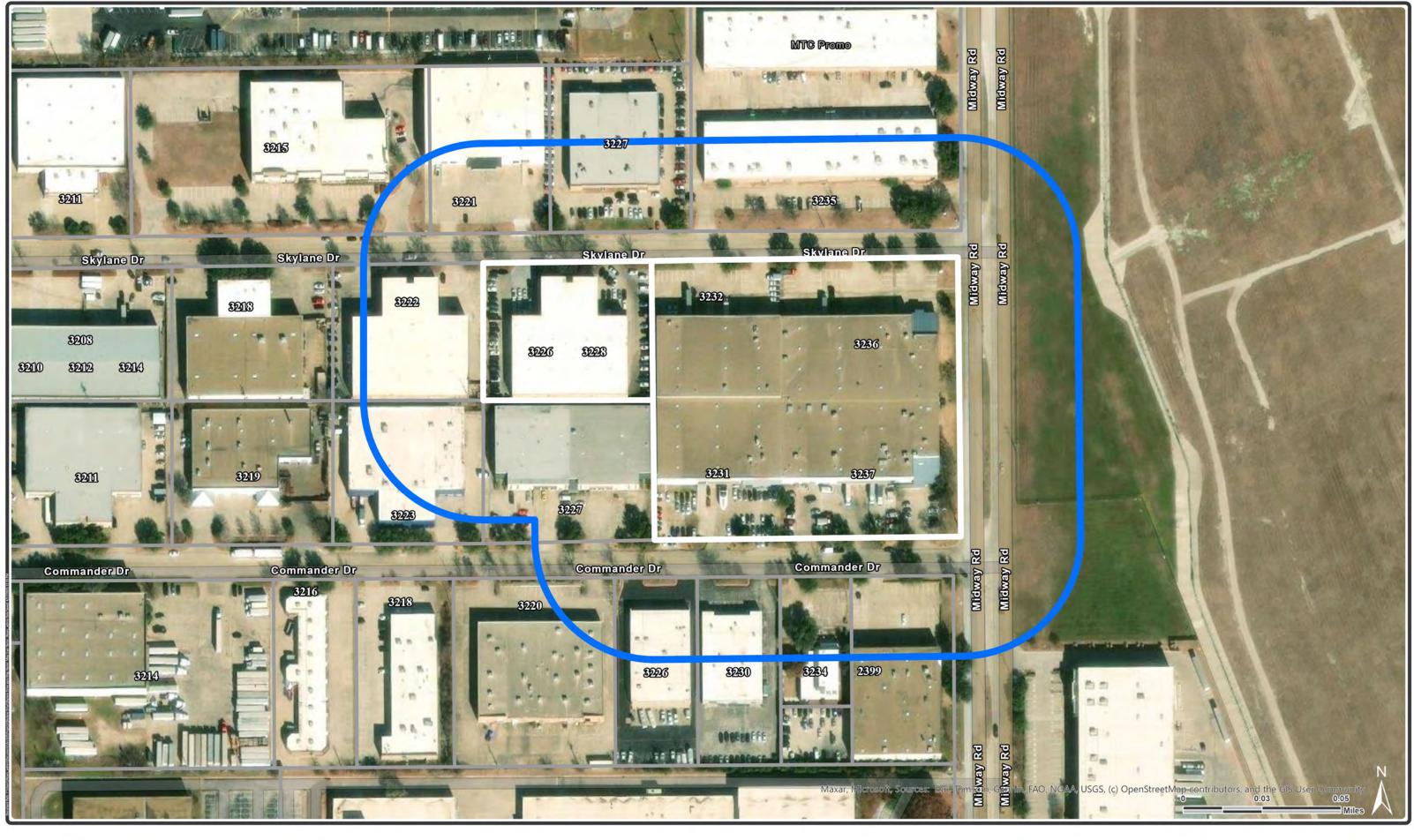

STAFF ANALYSIS

REQUEST

This is a city-initiated request for approval of an amendment to SUP-417 to remove the automatic expiration date of December 9, 2018, from the special conditions, restrictions, and regulations section of SUP-417.

ELEMENTS TO CONSIDER

- 1. The subject tract is surrounded by similar uses.
- 2. There are no residential-zoned properties near the subject property.
- 3. One public comment card was received in support.
- 4. In recent years, staff has not included an expiration date with Special Use Permits as it is no longer needed.

PURPOSE OF THE SPECIAL USE PERMIT

The purpose of the Special Use Permit is to authorize and regulate uses which may be beneficial in a specific instance to the general welfare of the community yet ensure that such uses are not detrimental to surrounding property and are consistent with the stated purpose of the zoning district in which such uses are located regarding conditions of operation, location, arrangement, and construction.

CONCLUSION

Michael McCauley, Senior Planner, presented this item. He advised this is a city-initiated request involving portions of two buildings. He advised that approximately ten years ago an SUP was granted with an expiration date of September 2018. He reviewed a location/zoning map and advised that surrounding uses include auto sales. Staff is recommending the removal of the expiration date as this is no longer needed in Special Use Permits.

Commissioner Martin inquired about the stipulation to allow outdoor display of vehicles. Mr. McCauley responded that in recent years staff has recommended keeping the vehicle inventory for sale indoors, however, in this case staff is recommending continuing allowing outdoor vehicle inventory.

Commissioner Hermon inquired about there not being a limit to the number vehicles included. Mr. McCauley responded that it is not applicable in this case; vehicles will be displayed within marked parking spaces while still providing customer and employee parking.

Commissioner Doyle asked whether any other SUPs for auto sales on this street have expiration dates. Mr. McCauley advised they do not, adding that is not the current practice of the city. Commissioner Doyle inquired as to whether the definition of a "shade tree" is included in the stipulation. Mr. McCauley listed several appropriate types of trees.

Chair Windrow opened the public hearing. There were no speakers.

Section 2.

Special Use Permit Number 417 established for a certain approximately 3-acre tract located at 3228 and 3232 Skylane Drive, and being more specifically described and generally depicted on Exhibit A, is hereby amended, restated and replaced, thereby superseding Ordinance Number 3717 in its entirety, to provide for the following:

I. Permitted Use

Automobile or Light Load Truck Sales (Used)

II. Special Development Standards

Development shall be in accordance with the following special conditions, restrictions, and regulations:

- 1. A minimum of three shade trees shall be planted along Skylane Drive in front of 3232 Skylane Drive.
- 2. All vehicles on the property shall be properly parked in designated parking spaces.

Section 3.

The Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and the Official Map are hereby amended to reflect the action taken herein.

Section 4.

Any person violating a provision of this ordinance, upon conviction, is guilty of an offense punishable as provided in Section 10.99 of the Carrollton City Code.

Section 5.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable in accordance with Section 10.07 of the Carrollton City Code.

Section 6.

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances of the City of Carrollton, Texas, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed.

Section 7.

Ordinance Number 1470, otherwise known as the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and the Official Zoning Map, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 8.

This ordinance shall become and be effective on and after its adoption and publication.

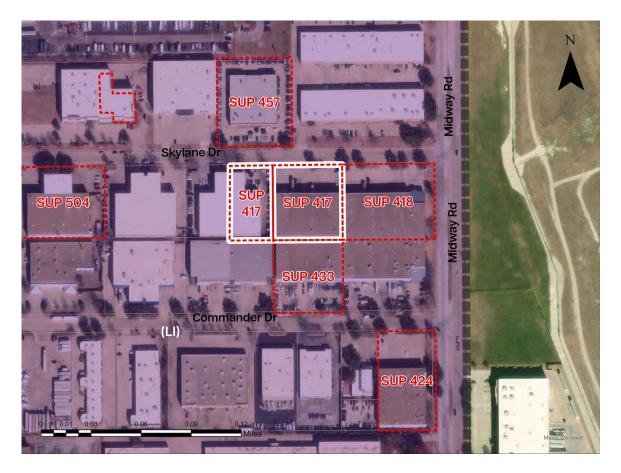

ORDINANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. The property is currently zoned PD-45 for the (LR-2) Local Retail District.

An approved SUP for an arcade is required in the (LR-2) Local Retail District.

2. The CZO defines 'amusement arcade' as:

"Any place or establishment wherein more than four (4) coin-operated, slug-or token-operated, or electronically, or mechanically controlled still or motion picture machines, projectors, or other image-producing devices, or skill machines, are located, whether operable or inoperable. Such machines shall include, but not be limited to, billiard tables, pool tables, and video games and simulated gambling device versions of bingo, keno, blackjack, video lottery terminals (VLTs), roulette, video poker, or facsimile thereof, that operate by chance or partially so."

- 3. Article 21 Special Use Permits, Section D(2)(j) of the CZO has the following regulations regarding arcades:
 - a. The number of simulated gambling devices may not exceed 75% of the total number of machines or tables located within the establishment.
 - b. All simulated gambling devices shall always be clearly visible from the interior side of the front door of the establishment.
 - c. Any windows located in perimeter walls of the establishment are prohibited from being obscured and shall be clear of any obstructions.
 - d. A label identifying compliance with state law must be clearly displayed on each simulated gambling device located within the establishment.
 - e. The Certificate of Occupancy issued by the City showing approval to operate an arcade shall be clearly displayed in the establishment.
 - f. A sign shall be posted on each simulated gambling device and on walls adjacent to such devices that states the following:

"This device is for entertainment purposes only and may not be used to provide payouts in violation of Section 47.01 of the Texas Penal Code."

g. Signs shall be posted throughout establishments containing simulated gambling devices such that no point in the establishment is more than 50 feet from the nearest sign. Such signs shall state:

"All devices are for entertainment purposes only. No device may be used for illegal gambling purposes. Violators will be prosecuted."

- h. For establishments not approved for smoking, "No Smoking" signs shall be posted throughout the establishment such that no point in the establishment is more than 50 feet from the nearest sign. Such signs shall be in accordance with the requirements set forth in Section 93.04 of the Code of Ordinances.
- i. The hours of operations shall be established by the Special Use Permit and the approved hours of operations shall be clearly posted at the entrance of the establishment.

ELEMENTS TO CONSIDER

- 1. The purpose of the Special Use Permit is to authorize and regulate uses which may be beneficial in a specific instance to the general welfare of the community, yet ensure that such uses are not detrimental to surrounding properties and are consistent with the stated purpose of the zoning district in which such uses are located regarding conditions of operation, location, arrangement and construction.
- 2. The amusement arcade will consist of 100 gaming stations.
- 3. Daily hours of operation shall be limited to 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- 4. No alcohol will be sold, consumed, or possessed on site.
- 5. No public comments were received.

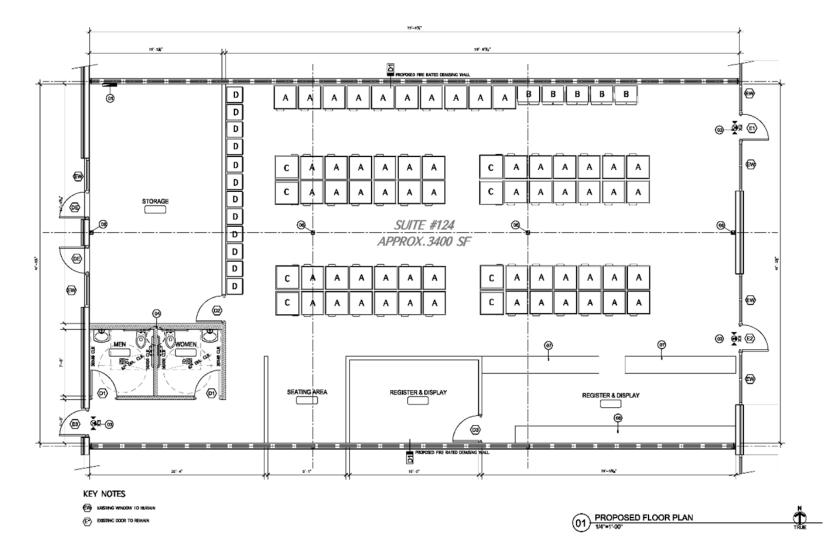

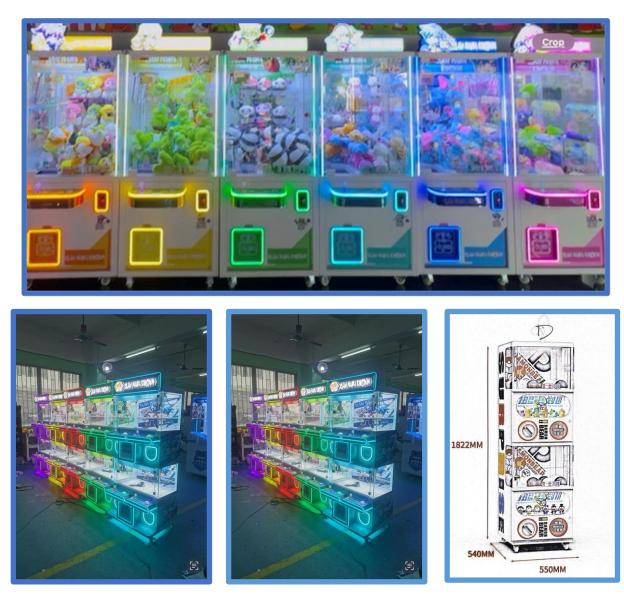
CONCLUSION

- 8. Daily hours of operation shall be limited to 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- 9. The hours of operation shall be clearly posted at the entrance of the establishment.

Section 3.

The Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and the Official Map are hereby amended to reflect the action taken herein.

Section 4.

Any person violating a provision of this ordinance, upon conviction, is guilty of an offense punishable as provided in Section 10.99 of the Carrollton City Code.

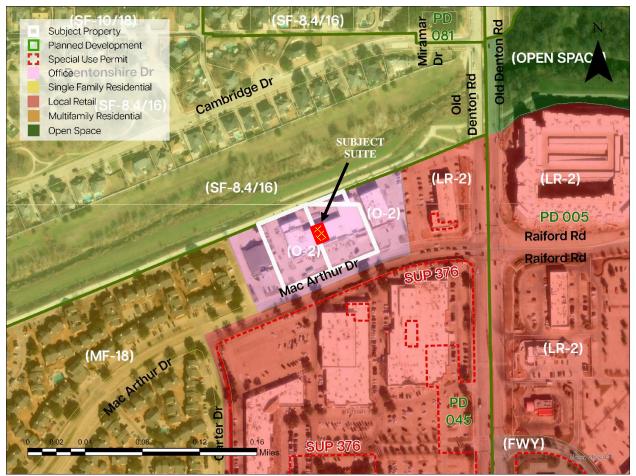

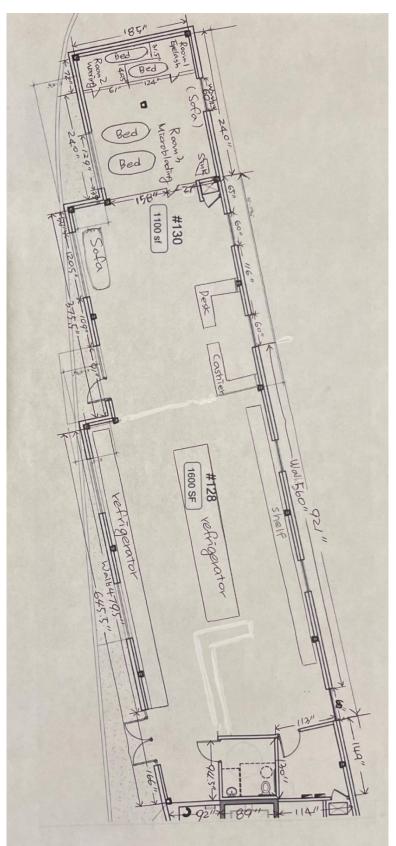

- 2. 1016 West Trinity Mills Road, Suite 128 shall be limited to one tattoo parlor;
- 3. The tattoo parlor use shall be limited to a maximum area of 308 square feet;
- 4. Business hours of operation shall not exceed periods between 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday.

Section 3.

The Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and the Official Map are hereby amended to reflect the action taken herein.

Section 4.

Any person violating a provision of this ordinance, upon conviction, is guilty of an offense punishable as provided in Section 10.99 of the Carrollton City Code.

Section 5.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable in accordance with Section 10.07 of the Carrollton City Code.

Section 6.

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances of the City of Carrollton, Texas, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed. Section 7.

Ordinance Number 1470, otherwise known as the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and the Official Zoning Map, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 8.

This ordinance shall become and be effective on and after its adoption and publication.

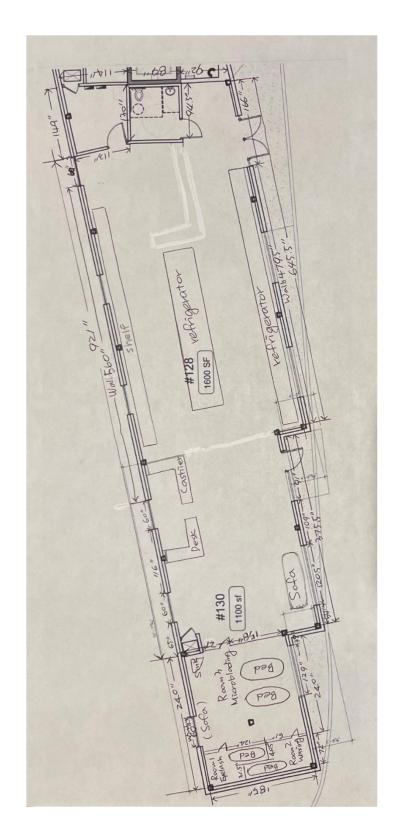

BACKGROUND:

The rise of digital platforms such as Airbnb and VRBO has led to an increase in resident property concerns regarding transient and vacation rental uses that infringe on the property rights of neighbors in the City of Carrollton. The City has had numerous speakers attend public meetings to express concerns about the increase in health, safety, and nuisance issues related to short-term rentals and bed and breakfasts.

The city wishes to advance the objectives of the Comprehensive Plan by championing established residential neighborhoods through regulations that support neighborhood identity and ensuring safety, which contributes to the overall character and livability of the neighborhoods.

Staff is recommending amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance (CZO) to enact an interim prohibition, for one year, on short term rentals (STRs) and bed and breakfasts (B&Bs) special use permits in order to respond to residents' concerns, and address issues with property owners and managers of STRs and B&Bs.

Revised zoning regulations will be brought forward to Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council within the one year period following the research and development of modified STR and B&B standards.

A separate set of interim permitting and minimum standards for STRs and B&Bs, Chapter 100, in the City Code of Ordinances, are under separate consideration on the agenda in order to provide an interim permitting mechanism for certain properties that are in compliance with the standards set forth in the proposed ordinance.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no financial implications on the current and future operating budgets regarding this request.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

On May 1, 2025, Planning & Zoning Commission recommended approval of the CZO text amendments for the interim prohibition of STRs and B&Bs.

Staff recommends approval with stipulations and adoption of the proposed ordinance.

For purposes of this subsection only, nonconforming uses include those operating as an STR or B&B prior to February 7, 2023, pursuant to Ordinance No. 4127.
- 5. Any STR or B&B that has been in operation subsequent to February 7, 2023, and prior to May 6, 2025, but has not received a special use permit, as anticipated in Ordinance No. 4127, may be eligible to continue operating upon receipt of a temporary permit pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 100 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances.
- 6. An STR or B&B that has received a special use permit or an STR or B&B that has non-conforming status, pursuant to Ordinance No. 4127, may continue to operate, as long as the operator remains in compliance with Chapter 97 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances.
- 7. This section D expires in its entirety on May 5, 2026.

GENERAL PROJECT INFORMATION

REQUEST: Approval of amendments to the Carrollton Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance (CZO) Amending Article V. Use of Land and Structures to enact an interim prohibition for Special Use Permits for short-term rentals and bed and breakfasts.

REPRESENTED BY: City of Carrollton

The public has complained that short-term rentals (STRs) and bed and breakfasts (B&Bs) in Carrollton disrupt their use of property due to unreasonable noise, excessive trash, disorderly conduct, and parking. Residents have indicated that some STR and B&B occupants are less concerned than long-term residents with the impact of conduct at STR and B&B premises on neighbors, due to the temporary nature of their occupancy and lack of community with the neighborhood.

The City of Carrollton's strategic vision states that Carrollton residents wish for a place that families and businesses want to call home, and residents have expressed that STRs and B&Bs negatively affect the desire of families to call Carrollton home because of the transient nature of the users of STRs and B&Bs. The City wishes to respond to residents' concerns and address issues with property owners and managers of STRs and B&Bs.

In response, the city staff is recommending enacting a one year temporary prohibition on STRs and B&Bs processed through a Special Use Permit (SUP). The imposition of the prohibition will still allow the uses to operate under the following conditions.

a. Subject to Article 21 on Special Use Permits and Article 22 on Nonconformity, STRs and B&Bs are prohibited in dwelling units, dwellings, and residences. For purposes of this subsection only, nonconforming uses include those operating as an STR or B&B prior to February 7, 2023, pursuant to Ordinance No. 4127.

What does this mean?

New STRs and B&Bs are prohibited through the SUP process in dwelling units, dwellings and residences (including in residential districts).

 b. Any STR or B&B that has been in operation subsequent to February 7, 2023, and prior to May 6, 2025, but has not received a special use permit, as anticipated in Ordinance No. 4127, may be eligible to continue operating upon receipt of a temporary permit pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 100 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances.

What does this mean?

This impacts operating STRs and B&Bs that do not have a Special Use Permit approved, but have submitted a complete Planning application for an SUP requesting the use, since February 7, 2023 but before May 6, 2025. In this instance an operator would need to acquire a temporary permit, during the one year prohibition period, subject to new interim permitting requirements that will be adopted in the City Code of Ordinances (Chapter 100).

c. An STR or B&B that has received a Special Use Permit or an STR or B&B that has nonconforming status, pursuant to Ordinance No. 4127, may continue to operate, as long as the operator remains in compliance with Chapter 97 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances.

What does this mean?

STRs and B&Bs with nonconforming status may continue as long as the operations are in compliance with the current standards – Chapter 97 of the Code of Ordinances.

In conclusion, the one year interim prohibition is necessary to provide interim provisions while prohibiting the application or issuance of a special use permit for short term rentals or bed and breakfasts, for approximately one year. An interim temporary permitting process will be in place during the prohibition period. The City shall conduct public outreach, collect data, and analyze information to determine permanent recommendations, due to community concerns about health and safety.

WHEREAS, at a public hearing held on the First day of May 2025, the Planning & Zoning Commission considered and made recommendation on a change to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City of Carrollton (Case No. PLZT 2025-074); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton, Texas ("City Council") conducted a public hearing on the Sixth day of May 2025, at which all persons were given an opportunity to present testimony; and

WHEREAS, the rise of digital platforms such as Airbnb and VRBO has led to an increase in resident property concern about transient and vacation rental uses that infringe on the property rights of neighbors in the City of Carrollton ("City"); and

WHEREAS, Carrollton residents have a right to peace and quiet enjoyment of their properties; and

WHEREAS, the City of Carrollton's strategic vision states that Carrollton residents wish for a place that families and businesses want to call home, and residents have expressed that STRs and B&Bs negatively affect the desire of families to call Carrollton home because of the transient nature of the users of STRs and B&Bs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to advance the objectives of the Comprehensive Plan by championing established residential neighborhoods through regulations that support neighborhood identity and ensuring safety, which contributes to the overall character and livability of the neighborhoods in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to respond to residents' concerns and address issues with property owners and managers of STRs and B&Bs; and

WHEREAS, the imposition of an interim prohibition does not cause any conforming use to become a non-conforming use, necessitating additional notice requirements pursuant to § 211.006 (a-1) of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, during the interim prohibition no new STRs or B&Bs may begin operation in the City and all existing STRs or B&Bs that were not granted non-conforming status under Ordinance No. 4127, adopted February 7, 2023, may operate, if qualified, upon receipt of a STR permit issued pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 100 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, after determining all legal requirements of notice and hearing have been met, has further determined the following interim prohibition of the special use permit process for short-term rentals would provide for and would be in the best interest of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1.

All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the City Council, and they are hereby approved, ratified and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

Section 2.

Article V. Use of Land and Structures of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, City of Carrollton, Texas, is hereby amended by adding a new Section D to provide an interim prohibition of the application or issuance of a special use permit for a "Short-Term Rental" or "Bed and Breakfast" as follows:

"SECTION D. Interim Prohibition on Short-Term Rental and Bed and Breakfast Uses

- 1. The purpose of this interim provision is to prohibit the establishment of new short-term rental ("STR") and bed and breakfast ("B&B") uses pursuant to the provisions set forth in Ordinance No. 4127 while the City conducts public outreach, collects data, and analyzes information to determine permanent recommendations, due to community concerns about health and safety.
- 2. A Short-term Rental means a residential premise, or portion thereof, used for lodging accommodations to occupants for a period of less than thirty (30) days that is not permanently occupied by the property owners listed on the county appraisal districts records for which the property is located.
- 3. A Bed and Breakfast means a residential premise, or portion thereof, used for lodging accommodations to occupants for a period of less than thirty (30) days and which is permanently occupied by the property owners listed on the county appraisal districts records for which the property is located.
- 4. Subject to Article 21 on Special Use Permits and Article 22 on Nonconformity, STRs and B&Bs are prohibited in dwelling units, dwellings, and residences. For purposes of this subsection only, nonconforming uses include those operating as an STR or B&B prior to February 7, 2023, pursuant to Ordinance No. 4127.
- 5. Any STR or B&B that has been in operation subsequent to February 7, 2023, and prior to May 6, 2025, but has not received a special use permit, as anticipated in Ordinance No. 4127, may be eligible to continue operating upon receipt of a temporary permit pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 100 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances.

Consider An Ordinance Establishing Title IX, Chapter 100. - Temporary Short-Term Rental And Bed And Breakfast Permit During Interim Prohibition To Regulate Short-Term Rental And Bed And Breakfast Uses.

BACKGROUND:

This agenda item introduces a new chapter to the City's Code of Ordinances-Chapter 100-Temporary Short-Term Rental and Bed and Breakfast Permit During Interim Prohibition-to supplement existing regulations governing short-term rental (STR) and bed and breakfast (B&B) properties. This ordinance builds upon Ordinance No. 4127, adopted on February 7, 2023, which granted non-conforming status to eligible STR and B&B operations in existence prior to Feb. 7, 2023, and established a special use permit (SUP) process for all new temporary housing uses.

In response to ongoing concerns regarding the impact of STRs and B&Bs on neighborhood stability and public safety, the City Council has considered and approved a one-year interim prohibition on the application and issuance of an SUP for STR and B&B uses (STR/B&B-SUP). During this period, the City would suspend new STR/B&B-SUP applications to allow time for further study and policy development. To support continued regulation of STR and B&B operations that were active prior to the proposed prohibition, but did not receive non-conforming status, Chapter 100 would establish a temporary permitting option subject to eligibility, enforcement, and revocation provisions. Key provisions:

- Establish a temporary lodging permit process for eligible STR and B&B properties during the proposed interim prohibition for locations that:
 - Do not have a documented code violation(s) in the past 12 months;
 - The owner, operator, or property manager is not a registered sex offender;
 - o The owner or operator has not been convicted of two or more violations of Ch.

97; and/or

• The property is not located within a Child Safety Zone.

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY:

This ordinance provides regulatory continuity while the City evaluates the long-term impacts and policy approach related to STRs and B&Bs. It ensures that eligible operations remain subject to appropriate health and safety standards and that neighborhood nuisance concerns can be addressed.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ACTION DESIRED:

Staff recommends approval of the proposed ordinance to Title IX, Chapter 100 of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances to provide a temporary permit process for eligible properties during the one-year interim prohibition on the short-term rental and bread and breakfast special use permit process.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, AMENDING TITLE IX, "HEALTH, SAFETY, AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE," BY ADOPTING A NEW CHAPTER 100, "TEMPORARY SHORT-TERM RENTAL AND BED AND BREAKFAST PERMIT DURING INTERIM PROHIBITION," OF THE CARROLLTON CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PERMIT PROCESS DURING THE INTERIM PROHIBITION OF SHORT-TERM RENTAL AND BED AND BREAKFAST **PROPERTIES;** ESTABLISHING **DEFINITIONS; ESTABLISHING PERMIT REQUIREMENTS; ESTABLISHING** SPECIFIC VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR MINIMUM STANDARDS AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION: PROVIDING FOR APPLICATION **STANDARDS;** OF ESTABLISHING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND **PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the City of Carrollton, Texas (the "City") is a Home-Rule municipality possessing the full power of local self-government pursuant to Article 11, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution, Section 51.072 of Texas Local Government Code and its Home Rule Charter; and

WHEREAS, Section 54.004 of the Texas Local Government Code provides that a home rule municipality may enforce ordinances necessary to protect health, life, and property and to preserve the good government, order, and security of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the City is further authorized to enact and enforce minimum standards relating to the use and occupancy of structures pursuant to Subchapter A of Chapter 214 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the regulation and licensure of permitted short-term rental business operations within the City is necessary and essential to the economic health of the community and the preservation and protection of the public welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton ("City Council") seeks to protect the public safety and preserve the quality of life within the City; and

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2025, the City Council considered and approved an interim prohibition on: (1) new short-term rental ("STR") and bed and breakfast ("B&B") uses in the City, and (2) the application and issuance of special use permits ("SUP") for such uses, as provided in Ordinance No. 4127; and

WHEREAS, during the interim prohibition, the City Council desires to provide a process for STR and B&B uses that were not operating in the City prior to the adoption of Ordinance No. 4127 on February 7, 2023, and have not received an SUP since that date; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to maintain and protect the health and safety of residents, the integrity of residential neighborhoods, and to avoid blight conditions from occurring it is necessary to adopt Chapter 100 to ensure that any STRs or B&Bs operating within the City of Carrollton,

who don't have non-conforming status or an SUP, operate in conformity with the standards the City Council adopted in Chapter 97 of the Code of Ordinances during the interim prohibition, but who aren't eligible to apply for a permit under Chapter 97 because they do not yet have the right to operate within the City pursuant to Ordinance No. 4127; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a temporary permit process, the City Council is not granting any land use rights, but is maintaining the status quo while the City Council studies the current process for STRs and B&Bs and determines how to regulate such uses in the future.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1.

All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the City Council, and they are hereby approved, ratified, and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2.

The Code of Ordinances of the City of Carrollton, Texas Title IX, "Health, Safety, and Property Maintenance," is hereby amended by adding a new Chapter 100 to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 100. TEMPORARY SHORT-TERM RENTAL AND BED AND BREAKFAST PERMIT DURING INTERIM PROHIBITION

Sec. 100.01. Purpose and eligibility.

On February 7, 2023, the City of Carrollton City Council adopted Ordinance No. 4127 ("Ord. 4127"), which provided non-conforming status to short-term rental ("STR") and bed and breakfast ("B&B") uses in operation prior to the effective date of Ord. 4127. In addition, Ord. 4127 set forth a STR and B&B special use permit ("STR/B&B-SUP") process for any STR and B&B not in operation prior to the effective date of Ord. 4127. After numerous public hearings for STR/B&B-SUP applications, the City Council determined on May 6, 2025, pursuant to a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission on May 1, 2025, to enact a interim prohibition on the STR/B&B-SUP process for a period of one (1) year, in order for the City to study the impacts of STRs and B&Bs within the City and to, potentially, adopt new STR and B&B regulations moving forward. All applications for an STR/B&B-SUP will be on hold until such time as the City Council reinstates the process or adopts new regulations. Owners of an STR or B&B that were in operation prior to May 6, 2025, but did not receive non-conforming status under Ord. 4127, may be eligible under this chapter to apply for a Permit, as defined in Section 100.02, to operate an STR or B&B during the interim prohibition on special use permits.

Sec. 100.02. Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter, the definitions found in Section 97.02 of the Code of Ordinances shall apply unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Permit. For the purpose of this chapter 100, "Permit" shall mean a temporary short-term rental or bed and breakfast lodging license issued for a period not to exceed one (1) year for properties that were not granted non-conforming status under Ord. 4127.

Complete Application. For the purpose of this chapter 100, "Complete Application" shall mean the fulfillment of the technical requirements relating to the form and content of the application as required by Ch. 97 of the Code of Ordinances or the criteria contained in Art. XXI of the Carrollton Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance.

Sec. 100.03. Exceptions.

- (A) This chapter does not apply to STR/B&B-SUP applications denied on the basis of one (1) or more of the following:
 - 1. Documented violations of applicable building, zoning, housing, fire, safety, and health regulations and codes within the preceding twelve (12) month period;
 - 2. The owner, operator, and/or their manager is or has been a registered sex offender;
 - 3. The owner or operator of the STR or B&B received and was convicted of more than two (2) citations for violations of chapter 97 or any other provision of the Code of Ordinances within the preceding twelve (12) month period; or
 - 4. The property where the STR or B&B will be located is within a Child Safety Zone, as defined in Section 130.24 of the Code of Ordinances.
- (B) This chapter does not apply to an STR or B&B that began operation after February 7, 2023, but before May 6, 2025, if the owner, operator, or manager of the STR or B&B did not submit a Complete Application for a lodging license and SUP prior to May 6, 2025 or within forty-five (45) days of the date of the notice of the requirement to apply for a lodging license.

Sec. 100.10. Permit required; fee.

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate an STR or B&B without first having obtained a Permit and paying the prescribed taxes and fees.
- (B) The lodging license fee for a Permit is set forth in chapter 31 of the Code of Ordinances.
- (C) The taxes for an STR and B&B are set forth in chapter 38 of the Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 100.11. Application for permit.

An eligible owner or operator seeking a Permit shall file an application with the DCO upon forms provided by the city and consistent with the requirements in Section 97.03 of the Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 100.12. Permit - Grounds for Denial.

A Permit may be denied for any grounds listed in Section 97.05 of the Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 100.13. Restrictions - Grounds for Revocation.

In addition to the grounds for revocation in Section 97.06 of the Code of Ordinances, a Permit may be revoked for the following:

- 1. Use of STR or B&B for the purpose of housing one (1) or more sex offenders;
- 2. Operating a structured sober, recovery, or other purpose living home or similar enterprise;
- 3. Selling illegal drugs;
- 4. Selling alcohol or another activity that requires a permit or license under the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code; or
- 5. Operating an Adult Entertainment Establishment, as set forth in Article XXIII, of the Carrollton Zoning Ordinance.

Sec. 100.14. Revocation of Permit and Appeals.

Revocation of a Permit and appeals under this chapter 100 will be governed by chapter 97 of the Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 100.15. Expiration of Chapter and any Permit Issued Under this Chapter.

The provisions of this chapter, and any Permit issued hereunder, shall expire on May 5, 2026, at 11:59 p.m.

Sec. 100.16. Penalty.

An operator, owner, manager, or responsible person who violates any provisions of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction is punishable as set forth in section 10.99 for each act of violation and for each day or part of a day during which the violation is committed, continued, or licensed."

SECTION 3.

Any Person violating a provision of this Ordinance, upon conviction, is guilty of an offense punishable as provided in Section 10.99 of the Carrollton City Code.

SECTION 4.

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable in accordance with Section 10.07 of the Carrollton City Code.

SECTION 5.

All other provisions of the Carrollton Code of Ordinances not expressly amended as stated herein shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6.

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances and of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carrollton, Texas, except where the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with provisions of such ordinances and such codes, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7.

All rights and remedies of the City of Carrollton are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any ordinances governing nuisances that have accrued at the time of effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 8.

This Ordinance shall become effective on and after its adoption and publication.
