- 3. Hold A Public Hearing To Consider An Ordinance **Amending The Zoning** To Establish A Special Use Permit For A Gas Station With Special Conditions On An Approximately 0.7-Acre Tract Zoned (LR-2) Local Retail District And Located At 1865 E. Rosemeade Parkway; Amending The Official Zoning Map Accordingly. **Case No. 09-17SUP1 7-Eleven**. Case Coordinator: Michael McCauley.
- Sr. Planner Michael McCauley presented the case stating the applicant was preparing to refurbish the existing building and expand the number of gas pumps to have a total of five pumps. The site improvements include roof top screening, new thin bricks as well as refurbishing and repainting the existing brick; brick canopy columns in lieu of the existing metal posts; enhanced landscaping where possible and parking lot restriping. Staff received one notice of support and recommended approval with the standard stipulation that it be constructed as shown on the exhibits in the case report.
